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a history of learning and literacy in nineteenth century england based on documentary and qualitative evidence this book explores people s desire to learn their ways of learning and practising writing and what meaning writing had for them at a time when there was little or no state education available

literacy is a perennial hot topic in britain and other english speaking countries concerns about falling standards and a literacy crisis are frequently raised in response governments initiate new policies and teaching guidelines this book addresses the current policies practices and media debates in england the us scotland and australia literacy and education examines how literacy is taught to children in primary schools the place of phonics in current policies and the arguments made for and against it how teachers deliver phonics lessons and how children engage with the method the range of literacy practices children engage with throughout the school day and how they contribute to literacy learning the contributions a social and critical perspective on literacy can make to current debates regarding teaching strategies a wide range of research conducted in the uk north america australia and other countries bringing together policy practice and public debate and drawing on the author s extensive research in a primary school this essential new textbook provides questions and tasks for readers to engage with literacy and education is ideal for advanced undergraduate and postgraduate students of literacy and education and students on pgce courses it will also be of interest to researchers and teachers

why are girls outperforming boys in literacy skills in the western education system today to date there have been few attempts to answer this question literacy and gender sets out to redress this state of affairs by re examining the social organization of literacy in primary schools in studying schooling as a social process this book focuses on the links between literacy gender and attainment the role school plays in producing social difference and the changing pattern of interest in this topic both within the feminist community and beyond gemma moss argues that the reason for girls relative success in literacy lies in the structure of schooling and in particular the role the reading curriculum plays in constructing a hierarchy of learners in class using fine grained ethnographic analysis of reading in context this book outlines methods for researching literacy as a social practice and understanding how different versions of what counts as literacy can be created in the same site

literacy is a key indicator for comparing individuals and nations in contemporary society it is central to public debates about the nature of the public sphere economic markets citizenship and self governance literacy and the politics of representation aims to uncover the constructed nature of public understandings of literacy by examining detailed examples of how literacy is represented in a range of public contexts it looks at the ways in which knowledge about literacy is created and distributed the location and relative power of the knowledge makers and examines the different semiotic resources used in such representations images and metaphors numerical and statistical models and textual narratives and how they are related to one another the book focuses on the uk from 1970 to the present but includes a range of international comparisons and examples in addition exemplar chapters offer a model of analysis that can be used to deconstruct the representations of social policy issues this book is vital reading for postgraduate students in the areas of education studies literacy discourse analysis and multimodality

does literacy lead automatically towards global transformations in thought and more abstract thinking processes or are the effects of literacy specific to the literacy practices and activities in this study bernardo demonstrates the importance of the context in which literacy practices take place and generates a new perspective on the acquisition of basic learning skills

most children engage with a range of popular cultural forms outside of school their experiences with film television computer games and other cultural texts are very motivating but often find no place within the official curriculum where children are usually restricted to conventional forms of literacy this book demonstrates how to use children s interests in popular culture to develop literacy in the primary classroom the authors provide a theoretical basis for such work through an exploration of related theory and research drawing from the fields of education sociology and cultural studies teachers are often concerned about issues of sexism racism violence and commercialism within the disco

thinking about literacy discusses the literacy of children in the infant years the author takes the view that the child is an active learner when he she arrives in school and that it is the school s job to build on what the child already knows the book addresses issues such as spelling writing and children talking and writing about moral matters it has an optimistic view of the potential of children to surprise us with their language and emphasises that literacy is for life not just for an hour

the essays research studies and pedagogical examples in this book provide a window into the embodied dimensions of literacy within a multiplicity of education spaces and literacy events inside and outside of institutional contexts and a toolbox for interpreting building on and inquiring into the range of ways people communicate and express themselves as literate beings

media literacy is often focused on evaluating the message rather than reflecting on the medium bringing together postphenomenology media ecology posthumanism and complexity theory richard lewis s book offers a method for such a reflection and shows how our everyday media environments constitute us as post human subjects one that is becoming and constitutes through relations also with our media technologies an original interdisciplinary effort including for example the term intrasubjective mediation and a must read book for everyone interested in how we become with and through technologies prof mark coeckelbergh university of vienna technology media literacy and the human subject is a clearly and concisely written book that employs a fruitful transdisciplinary approach it at once offers an excellent grounding in the literature whilst simultaneously developing a useful tool for students to reflect deeply and critically upon their own engagement with media thoroughly recommended alexander thomas university of east london what does it mean to be media literate in today s world how are we transformed by the many media infrastructures around us we are immersed in a world mediated by information and communication technologies icts from hardware like smartphones smartwatches and home assistants to software like facebook instagram twitter and snapchat our lives have become a complex interconnected network of relations scholarship on media literacy has tended to focus on developing the skills to access analyze evaluate and create media messages without considering or weighing the impact of the technological medium how it enables and constrains both messages and media users additionally there is often little attention paid to the broader context of interrelations which affect our engagement with media technologies this book addresses these issues by providing a transdisciplinary method that allows for both practical and theoretical analyses of media investigations informed by postphenomenology media ecology philosophical posthumanism and complexity theory the author proposes both a framework and a pragmatic instrument for understanding the multiplicity of relations that all contribute to how we affect and are affected by our relations with media technology the author argues persuasively that the increased awareness provided by this posthuman approach affords us a greater chance for reclaiming some of our agency and provides a sound foundation upon which we can then judge our media relations this book will be an indispensable tool for educators in media literacy and media studies as well as academics in philosophy of technology media and communication studies and the post humanities

the nature of literacy is an issue of global debate when the national literacy strategy nls was introduced into uk schools it was arguably the most ambitious educational reform programme in the world and the controversy necessarily intensified how can the impact of such reforms be assessed in its ten year history the nls affected every primary and secondary teacher in the country and therefore every child the initiative provoked a widespread recognition of the importance of literacy for all children and attracted the attention of many other governments this book is the first definitive and objective review and evaluation of the impact of these literacy reforms with contributions from the most respected experts on literacy and english from the uk and from across the world this unprecedented critical examination explores how teaching policy and practice were impacted by the reforms how the nls came into being how it was operated what it did and did not achieve what we can learn from its successes and failures the most important aspects of the reforms from policing grammar to the impact of the literacy game and informed prescription on teaching whether you are a policy maker or classroom teacher this book is an invaluable resource to anyone concerned about literacy it provides readers from around the world with a genuine and evidence based perspective on this immense initiative lucidly evaluating the lessons learned from both its ambitions and its failures

social literacies develops new and critical approaches to the understanding of literacy in an international perspective it represents part of the current trend towards a broader consideration of literacy as social practices and as its title suggests it focuses on the social nature of reading and writing and the multiple character of literacy practices

this book challenges conventional theories about literacy and the practices which often arise from them it attempts to provide a new perspective through which the variety of literacy practices across different cultures can be viewed and

from which the practical issues that arise in specific literacy campaigns and programmes can be approached Dr Street first examines the explicit theories developed about literacy within different academic disciplines on the premise that these underlie statements about literacy within development campaigns and in everyday usage he analyses in detail arguments about the technical and neutral nature of literacy and its supposed cognitive consequences in the work of some psychologists linguists and social anthropologists he claims that these amount to a coherent but flawed model that he terms the autonomous model of literacy against this he poses an ideological model one which pays greater attention to the social structure he attempts to bring together recent shifts in this direction in writings on literacy and to construct a coherent model for further work

with the introduction of the literacy hour in 1998 the case for harnessing parental involvement in promoting children's literacy was stronger than ever originally published in 1999 this book offered a detailed and practical approach based on three key concepts keeping the child in the driving seat continuing support from the school to the parents and daily reading at home it is presented in an accessible manner and offers practical advice to teachers in running and evaluating a scheme it also gives parents a chance to think about the nature of their involvement at word sentence and text levels introducing them to the framework of the national literacy strategy good reading skills are essential for access to the wider curriculum yet above all reading is fun this book helped teachers parents and children to work together to make reading at home more enjoyable it was also to help ensure that children achieved the standards of literacy expected for their age by 2002 today it can still be used to help children learn to read

this volume demonstrates how literacy is more than learning to read and write literacy creates communities organizes personal and social lives makes possible civil society and the rule of law and underwrites the commitment of both modern and developing societies to universal education and ever higher levels of literate competence everything that is involved in being and becoming literate is the concern of this interdisciplinary group of distinguished scholars

talking about literacy re-examines dominant notions of what literacy is and challenges the problem solution reflex to the issue the problem is illiteracy the solution is more literacy literacy has enormous emotional and political associations and the job of literacy educator often concerns changing attitudes and challenging prejudices whether in the form of publicity strategies counselling new students or in curriculum design in short adult literacy education means not only teaching courses like fresh start basic skills study skills communication skills language support and return to study but also designing strategies to encourage people to see that these courses may meet their own interests and educating them and others to rethink their own negative attitudes to illiteracy the book looks in detail in at five principles put forward by Jane Mace as central to the education of people who often can read but wish they could read better who technically can write but have a desire to do so with more expression and coherence these principles focus on five themes context inquiry authorship equality and community since it is all too easy for literacy education involving adults who do not have formal qualifications to stop short of teaching techniques for correct writing these principles mean taking seriously a view that adult students are writers as well as readers that they have an entitlement to be read as well as to read others
