Although the Medellín text is not a document of liberation theology, it laid the foundations for most of it, and liberation theology developed rapidly in the Latin American Catholic Church after it was written. Robin Nangle argues that the theology of liberation is inadequate for genuine social reform. Anthropologist Manuel Vasquez argues that the theology of liberation introduced by CEBs produces a double impact since it gives the theological rationale for the opposition and acts to coordinate resistance in the intellectual fusion between liberation theology and sandinismo.
