the past decade has witnessed an explosion of interest and research on close relationships and social cognition in both areas numerous handbooks textbooks and journal articles have been published however it is the editors impression that although cognitive theories and concepts have filtered through to research dealing with close relationships much of this research reflects a relatively untutored understanding of the theoretical and empirical work in social cognition conversely the research literature that provides a more sophisticated perspective on the role of cognition in close relationships typically reveals a relatively limited knowledge of the literature on close relationships as researchers who have worked in both social cognitive processes and close relationships fletcher and fincham are convinced that each field has much to offer the other in fact their book is based on two important postulates first that a social cognitive framework offers a valuable resource for developing our understanding of close relationships and second that studying cognition within close

relationships has the potential to inform our understanding of basic social cognitive processes

only the most naïve or tendentious among us would deny the extent and intensity of suffering in the world can one hold consistently with the common view of suffering in the world that there is an omniscient omnipotent perfectly good god this book argues that one can wandering in darkness first presents the moral psychology and value theory within which one typical traditional theodicy namely that of thomas aquinas is embedded it explicates aquinas s account of the good for human beings including the nature of love and union among persons eleonore stump also makes use of developments in neurobiology and developmental psychology to illuminate the nature of such union stump then turns to an examination of narratives in a methodological section focused on epistemological issues the book uses recent research involving autism spectrum disorder to argue that some philosophical problems are best considered in the context of narratives using the methodology argued for the book gives detailed innovative exegeses of the stories of job samson abraham and isaac and mary of bethany in the context of these stories and against the backdrop of aquinas s other views stump presents aquinas s own theodicy and shows that aquinas s theodicy gives a powerful explanation for god s allowing suffering she concludes by arguing that this explanation constitutes a consistent and cogent defense for the problem of suffering

this lively and accessible study of media and discourse combines theoretical reflection with empirical engagement and brings together insights from a range of disciplines within media and cultural studies the study of media texts is dominated by an exclusive focus on representation this book adds long overdue attention to social interaction the book is divided into two sections the first outlines key theoretical issues and concepts including informalisation genre hybridisation positioning dialogism and discourse the second is a sustained interrogation of social interaction in and around media re examining issues of representation and interaction it critically

thirteen essays treat children from the pre civil war generation to 1950 as active influential participants in society the essays are organized into four topics cultural and regional variation toys and play family life and the ways evolving memories of childhood shape how adults think of themselves

this book examines the fundamental role of politics in funding our public schools and fills a conceptual imbalance in the current literature in school finance and educational policy unlike those who are primarily concerned about cost efficiency kenneth wong specifies how resources are allocated for what purposes at different levels of the government in contrast to those who focus on litigation as a way to reduce funding gaps he underscores institutional stalemate and the lack of political will to act as important factors that affect legislative deadlock in school finance reform wong defines how politics has sustained various types of rules that affect the allocation of resources at the federal state and local level while these rules have been remarkably stable over the past twenty to thirty years they have often worked at cross purposes by fragmenting policy and constraining the education process at schools with the greatest needs wong s examination is shaped by several questions how do these

rules come about what role does politics play in retention of the rules do the federal state and local governments espouse different policies in what ways do these policies operate at cross purposes how do they affect educational opportunities do the policies cohere in ways that promote better and more equitable student outcomes wong concludes that the five types of entrenched rules for resource allocation are rooted in existing governance arrangements and seemingly impervious to partisan shifts interest group pressures and constitutional challenge and because these rules foster policy fragmentation and embody initiatives out of step with the performance based reform agenda of the 1990s the outlook for positive change in public education is uncertain unless fairly radical approaches are employed wong also analyzes four allocative reform models two based on the assumption that existing political structures are unlikely to change and two that seek to empower actors at the school level the two models for systemwide restructuring aimed at intergovernmental coordination and or integrated governance would seek to clarify responsibilities for public education among federal state and local authorities above all integrating political and educational accountability the other two models identified by wong shift control from state and district to the school one based on local leadership and the other based on market forces in discussing the guiding principles of the four models wong takes care to identify both the potential and limitations of each written with a broad policy audience in mind wong s book should appeal to professionals interested in the politics of educational reform and to teachers of courses dealing with educational policy and administration and intergovernmental relations

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
